Merriam-Webster defines war as "a state of opened and declared armed hostile conflict between states or nations".<sup>[1]</sup> Lexico defines war as "A state of armed conflict between different countries or different groups within a country".<sup>[2]</sup> Conflicts causing at least 1,000 deaths in one calendar year are considered wars by the Uppsala Conflict Data Program.<sup>[3]</sup> For other conflicts, see rebellions, coups and separate battles.

The exact origin of Ansaru is unclear, but it had already existed as Boko Haram faction<sup>[32]</sup> before officially announcing its foundation as separate group on 1 January 2012.<sup>[32][33][34]</sup> The group has no known military presence in Nigeria since 2015, but several of its members appear to be still active.<sup>[35]</sup>
- b. The SPLM-IO accused JEM of supporting Kiir's government since 2013, though JEM has denied any involvement and claims to maintain neutrality in the South Sudanese Civil War.<sup>[102]</sup> The [Sudanese](#) government,<sup>[103]</sup> aid workers<sup>[102]</sup> and other sources<sup>[104]</sup> have however affirmed that JEM is taking part in conflict on the side of the South Sudanese government.<sup>[105]</sup>
- c. The Cobra Faction openly opposed the government until 2014, and remained in relative opposition until 2015, when it divided into a pro-government and pro-SPLM-IO faction, the latter of which formed the Greater Pibor Forces. In early 2016, the Cobra Faction

effectively disbanded, when the remaining group joined the government.<sup>[110][111]</sup> In September 2016, however, the Cobra Faction was declared restored by some of its commanders and declared that it had resumed its struggle against the government.<sup>[112]</sup>
